Dear Brothers & Sisters,

In the coming weeks Grace Moravian Church will "Mission undertaking a Study" which is one of the foundational steps required the Interim Ministry process. A Mission Study is a study of our church from top to bottom with the goals of discerning our strengths, weaknesses a n d opportunities as we move forward. A good Mission Study will include goals and objectives for the next three to five years similar to a Long Range or Strategic plan. It will also become the underlying document that is used in determining the suitability for the selection of your future Pastor.

This Mission Study will include findings about the congregation and the community in which we minister. It provides an

opportunity for you, the members of GMC to prayerfully study what scripture says about the church, to learn new information about your community and its needs, to learn who GMC has been and who you are as a congregation, while we also celebrate your gifts as a church.

The first step of this "Mission Study" asks that you take time to prayerfully consider and answer a survey that has been designed for your particular congregation. The completed surveys will be read by a committee of three persons, the answers compiled and brought back to you as statistical data.

The second step is a meeting of the community, giving the opportunity to talk about the history of the church, how you view the church and how the church is seen by the community. Everyone is encouraged to attend this meeting. This meeting is scheduled for **April 19 at 3:00** in the Fellowship Hall. It should last approximately 1 hour 30 minutes. Please make every effort to participate.

The third step in this process is second а community meeting, the date to be announced later. This meeting allows a time to receive the results of the survey and to discuss the findings. The goal for this meeting is to set goals for the next three to five years. Again, it is important that all voices be heard.

This work can be lifegiving as you learn from one another, as you listen and pray together for the church and for God's guidance.



We have been blessed with the support of Grace Moravian Church for our Ministry. We thank you all for your prayers and donations and for the ladies that are a part of this group. We welcome new members and are always happy to share our Ministry where ever needed.

To date, since our report in the Church Council Booklet we have delivered over 200 items and it is just March! We want to thank our delivery team for their non-stop efforts to get items delivered as soon as we can get them ready.

As a reminder, we make lots of different items including shawls, lap robes, baby blankets, special afghans, chemo caps, preemie baby caps, children's' toys, gift/sunshine bags, scarves, pillows, mittens, miscellaneous items such as tissue covers and felted heart bowls for Synod. We have even worked jointly on a baby sweater.

Palm Crosses

On Palm Sunday at the close of the service, you will be offered the opportunity to place the palm branches at the foot of the cross and receive a cross made from dried palm leaves as a sign of dedication or rededication of your life to Jesus Christ.

These Palm crosses have a story and I would like to share that with you. We ordered them from African Palms USA, founded in 1965 by Anglican Priest, Father Alan Talbot who had served as a missionary to Tanzania. During his six years of service, Father Talbot observed the poverty of the people and sought ways for them to increase their income. He encouraged the villagers to begin weaving palm crosses to sale to churches for use on Palm Sunday.

The crosses are made throughout the year in villages near Masasi, Tanzania, performed by families at home or while



guarding the nearby cashew crops from baboons. This allows the villagers to purchase household supplies and family needs such as school fees for their children or bicycles for transportation. The palm are made only from the leaves, crosses leaving the trees intact and the crosses environmentally friendly. Since its inception, African Palms USA has awarded nearly \$2 million to African communities to help meet basic human needs such as clean drinking water, HIV/AIDS education, fighting hunger, and farming ventures.

Enjoy your cross, knowing that Grace Moravian Church has helped make life a little easier for Tanzanian families.

February receipts totaled \$19,807 including unrestricted contributions of \$19,323 and restricted gifts of \$148. Our disbursements totaled \$25,920 including \$2,499 for power and heating fuel costs, \$618 for HVAC repairs, \$1,673 for new parlor furniture, and \$2,000 toward a pre-capital campaign assessment study. Our 2015 deficit increased by \$2,841 to \$4,669 based on our monthly budget of \$22,164. Thank you for allowing Grace Moravian Church's ministries to continue with your faithful stewardship. Thank you for your generosity.


